The parade was filled with Military Vehicles, marching soldiers, motorcycle groups, colorful floats, sporty cars, unique displays, helicopters both on the ground and in the air, dignitaries, local celebrities and more. This was "The Parade They Never Got," it was big, and the streets were filled with cheering crowds. It was both wonderful and emotional. This year we expect a much larger parade with many more color guards, military vehicles, re-enactment groups, floats and bands.
