Happy New Year! We are grateful for the *selfless service* and valor of our uniformed men and women who have sacrificed to preserve liberty for each generation. *We salute* our Soldiers, Marines, Sailors, Airmen, Guardians and Coast Guardsmen deployed around the world, who work diligently to *protect the freedoms* we are able to enjoy every day.

As we kick off 2025, two recent national, prominent historical items of note. *First*, on January 2, President Joseph R. Biden, Jr., posthumously recognized former VWC colleague, and dear friend, renowned Vietnam War correspondent and author—the late <u>Joseph Lee Galloway</u>—with the Presidential Citizens Medal. The award was presented to Joe's widow Gracie (at right). You can watch the 18-minute <u>recorded ceremony</u> with all honorees, as well as read Galloway's citation on the <u>White House</u> <u>press release</u>. In addition, check out his <u>Oral History Interview</u> to hear his story in his own words. *Second*, on January 3, the Medal of Honor was awarded to seven recipients, two Vietnam veterans: Captain Hugh R.
